# Climate Pollution Reduction Grants

- \$5 billion through EPA from federal Inflation Reduction Act of 2022
- **Phase 1:** \$250 million through formula grants for planning to states, tribal nations, and 67 of the most populous metropolitan statistical areas
- **Phase 2:** \$4.6 billion through competitive grants to implement those plans



# Funding for Phase 1: CPRG Planning

- \$3 million for each state
- \$1 million for 67 most populous metropolitan areas
  - Portland/Hillsboro/Vancouver is the only one in Oregon
  - Metro Regional Government is leading this planning effort
- \$110,000 for interested Tribal Nations in EPA Region 10 who submitted a notice of intent to participate

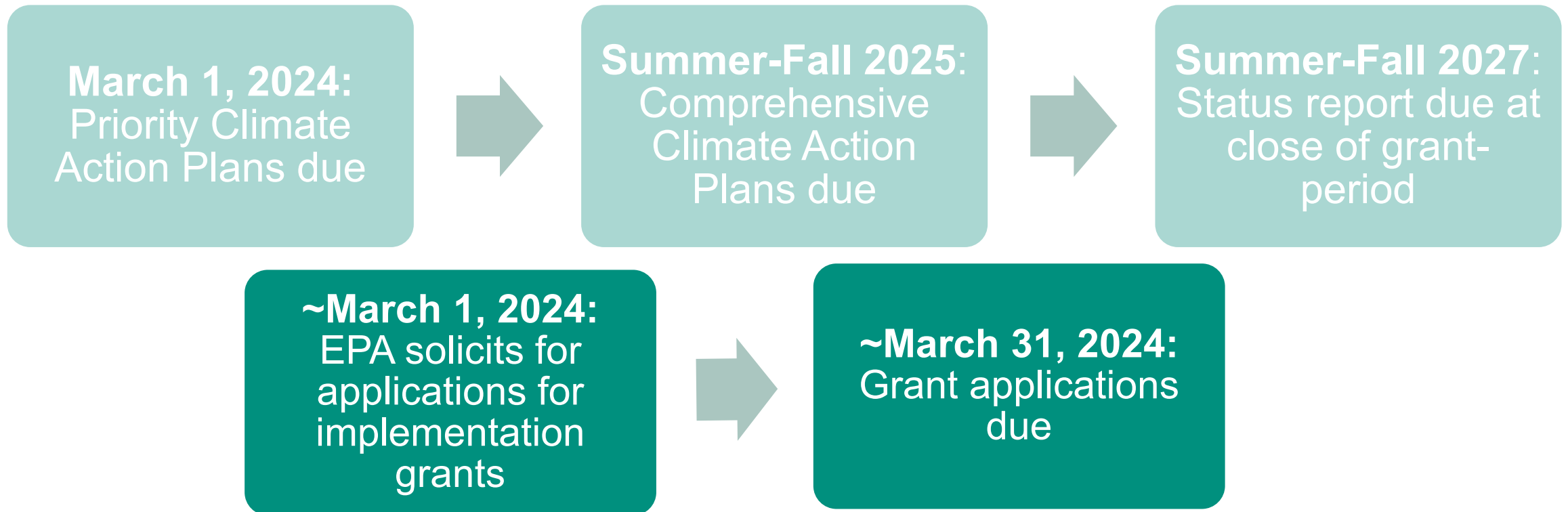

# Phase 2: CPRG Implementation Grants

\$4.6 billion in competitive grants from EPA, with more guidance on these grants later this year.

**Four main components within the Priority Climate Action Plan:**

**Oregon's GHG emissions inventory**

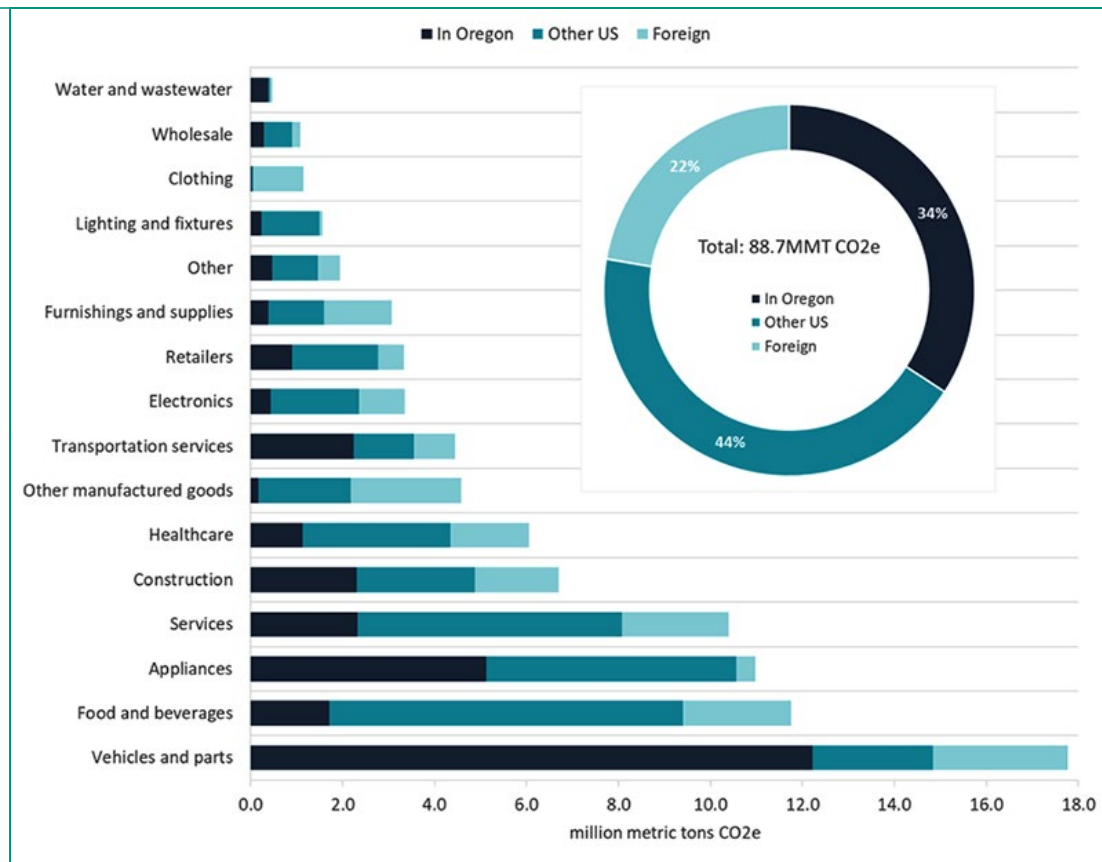
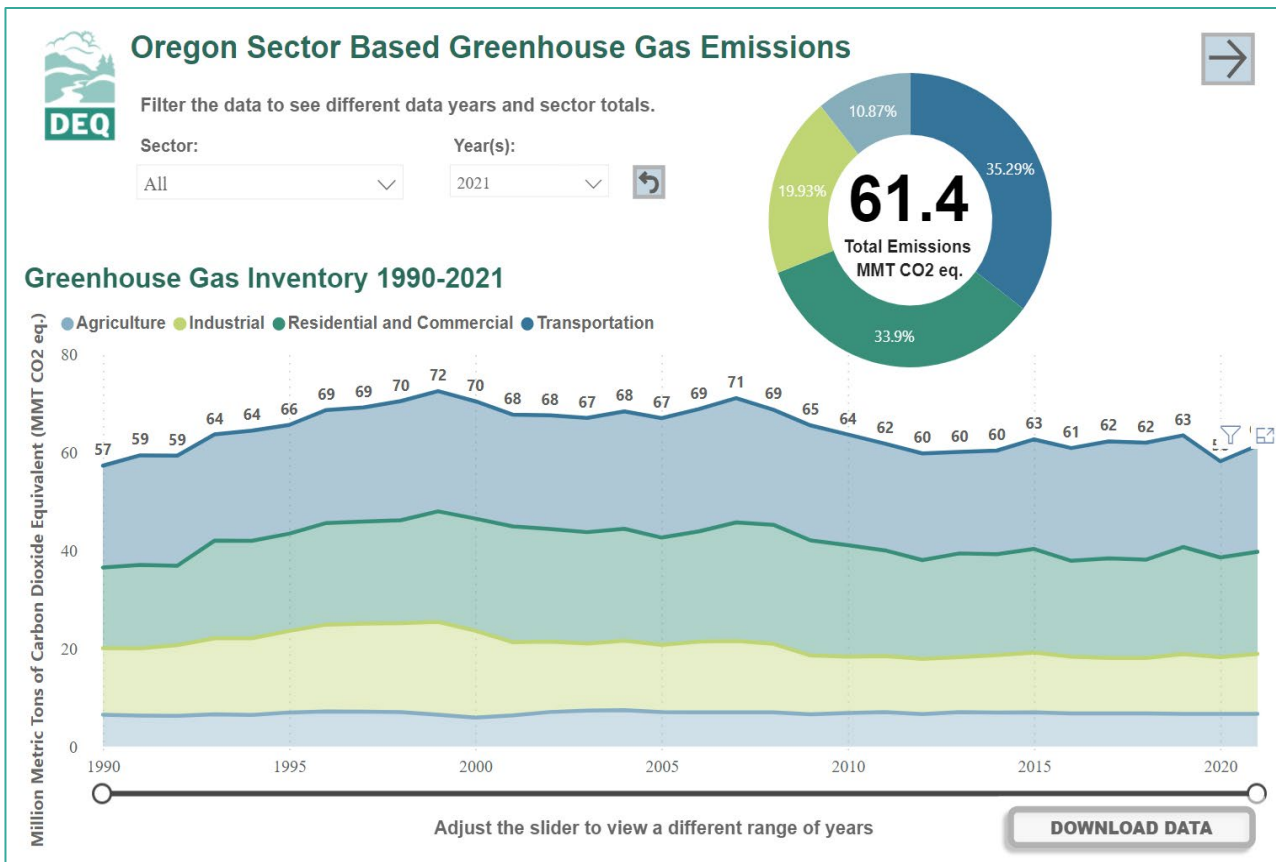
**Quantified GHG reduction measures**

**A low-income and disadvantaged communities benefits analysis**

**A review of authority to implement measures**

# Priority Climate Action Plan Timeline

**Summer & Fall:** identify GHG measures with state agencies, local governments, community orgs, and Tribal Nations

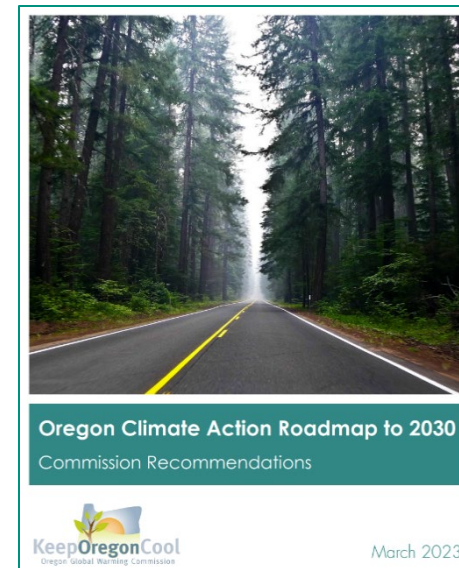


**~ November:** publish draft PCAP for public comment



**~ January, 2024:** publish final PCAP

- Start from Oregon's existing climate planning efforts, such as the Global Warming Commission's recent Roadmap to 2030
- Build upon those efforts with input from across state government, local governments, community organizations, and Tribal Nations
  - Coordinate with Metro to align with Portland Metro PCAP
